## \$300,000 Available to West Alabama Landowners Interested in Forestry Initiative

**AUBURN, December 20, 2016** – USDA’s Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) State Conservationist Ben Malone announced a collaborative effort to reach forestry landowners will continue in West Alabama. NRCS Alabama will partner with the U.S. Endowment for Forestry and Communities, Federation of Southern Cooperatives (FSC) and the Limited Resource Landowners Educational and Assistance Network (LRLEAN) to provide assistance to forest landowners in 11 counties.

Landowners in Bullock, Choctaw, Dallas, Greene, Hale, Macon, Marengo, Perry, Pickens, Sumter and Wilcox Counties are encouraged to apply for Conservation Activity Plans (CAPs) and practices through the forestry initiative by January 20, 2017.



The U.S. Endowment for Forestry and Communities (Endowment) was awarded an Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) agreement under the Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP) to demonstrate sustainable forestry technologies and create a support system and market access to historically underserved landowners in Alabama.

Several landowners have enrolled in the initiative and are working to preserve, restore and enhance forestland on their properties. Over the last three fiscal years, more than \$868,000 was obligated to fund 150 contracts in the 11 county area.

“This partnership has been a success and we believe these investments help strengthen rural communities one landowner at a time,” said NRCS State Conservationist Ben Malone. “Land returned to healthy forests will have beneficial conservation and environmental impacts for years to come.”
